Ms. Williams returned to Saginaw in 2002, after residing in Miami, FL for 16 years. In Miami, she served as the Program Coordinator and Nurse Practitioner for two school-based health centers in two high schools that served more than 3000 students for 10 years. She has served as a national consultant on school-based health care and has made numerous presentations in several major cities over the past few years.

Ms. Williams received her formal high school education at St. Stephens Catholic High School in Saginaw, she attended Michigan State University and received her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Florida A&M University, Tallahassee, FL; She received her certification as an adult nurse practitioner and her master's degree in nursing from Florida International University, Miami, Florida.

Ms. Williams has published several nursing articles and has been the recipient of many prestigious awards throughout her 30 year plus nursing career; that includes Outstanding Nursing Alumni Recipient in 2007 from Florida International University in Miami. She is the incoming President of the School-Community Health Alliance of Michigan for school-based health care. Ms. Williams served as past president of the National Black Nurses Association-Miami Chapter from 1991-1995 in which the chapter received numerous recognitions for its community mobilization efforts during Hurricane Andrew along with the production of 13 television shows that focused on African American health issues during that time.
